RESEARCH THEME: Religion and Spirituality

This theme brings together research projects that relate in one way or another to the diversity of religious practice, thought and spirituality that shape European identity from late antiquity to the early modern period. Religion and spirituality can never be separated from the cultural and intellectual framework in which they emerge. While European culture has been shaped by a complex interaction of different Christian traditions, it has also been significantly influenced by Jewish and Islamic traditions, as well as by elements of pagan belief deriving from pre-Christian culture.
